-The PC received an update from Helen Terry of The Greenways Project that in light of the Council's concerns, and taking into account the village Neighbourhood plan, that they intend to relocate the end of the trail to West Acre.

#### 8. Correspondence

# a. Digger in river at Jubilee Bridge Castle Acre

-Several residents raised their concerns with the PC regarding recent ground work taking place at the Ran Revir property near Jubilee Bridge and the potential damage to the River banks and a site of archaeological interest. The Chairman informed the meeting that Cllr Moriarty had been on site to speak with the developers and inform appropriate local authorities of the concerns. The Clerk was asked to inquire with the BC Planning Office to confirm that the planning application is still valid.

#### b. National launch of life-saving public emergency alerts and date of test message

-Clerk circulated an email to Cllrs regarding the Government's emergency alert test on April 23<sup>rd</sup> 2023.

#### c. CA Fishing Club - new wire fence along the riverside

Castle Acre Fishing Club have installed a new wire fence along the riverside from Jubilee Bridge upstream as far as the Castle Meadow. There will be a locked gate by Jubilee Bridge to prevent casual walkers gaining access. This has been installed with the agreement of Holkham Estate because they have started grazing this field and want to prevent livestock getting into the river. The Fishing Club refer to this section of the Nar as "Bevan's Beat" after Mike Bevan who was Chairman of the club many years ago.

### d. Holkham Signage, Bricknel Close

The PC had been contacted by a resident with concerns about the large signage outside the entrance to Bricknel Estate. The Clerk received confirmation from the site manager that the signs will be taken down when the properties are sold. A Cllr has also been informed that enquiries had been made with the BC as to whether a planning application had been made to erect the signage.

### 9. Reports

**Highways** – Cllr Mason has discussed potential electric charging points at the playing field car park with the Chair of CAPFA. Although the idea was supported in principle, development of this area of the playing field will not occur in the near future.

**Village hall** – Cllr Hickey reported that following the confirmation of the £37,600 grant, that the PV panels had been ordered. The Committee also plans to apply to the Platinum Jubilee fund to complete the kitchen remodelling.

School - No new updates.

**CAPFA** – The committee is holding an AGM next week. Funding for the MUGA court has a shortfall ~£10k and other funding options are to be explored.

**BCKLWN (BC)** – Cllr Moriarty discussed the following items: New Prosperity fund secured from Government to support schemes that help create a sense of community, pride and belonging.

**Norfolk County Council (NCC)** – Cllr Moriarty discussed the following items: Government Emergency Alert Services, County Deal for Norfolk, Making it Real Board Launch new training programme, Trees for Norfolk.
