## Signs & Stones

Look left (near old village school) for a house where the old roof line has been lifted – it's higher now. You can see the old line.

What is the house name? \_\_\_\_\_

The pub is on the right on Stocks Green. On its sign is a bird (symbol of the Holkham estate).

Nearby is a sign, (high in the brickwork), meaning pilgrims could stay here when visiting the Priory.

Walk past the church to South Acre Road. On the corner is Abbey House where stones in the walls are cut in a check pattern


What could the high up hooks be for? \_\_\_\_\_

Walk down the lane & turn left into Chimney Street. At the end of the row of houses is a much newer one.

What date was it built? \_\_\_\_\_

Follow the lane – lots of wildlife here. See a butterfly / flower / fruit.

Draw a picture of something you find here.




At the road junction next there are footpath signs with arrows.

Turn left & walk to Bailey Street at the end of this lane. Halfway up, turn left into Pales Green. Here, on the left, is one of the oldest houses in the village.


What is its name? \_\_\_\_\_

Further up Bailey Street, turn right in the little lane between the Old Red Lion & Marcon House, see carved stones beside a garden gate, one on each side.

At the top of the street, to the left of the arch, see cut stones amongst the flints in the wall of a cottage.

Back through the Bailey Gate, cross the road & turn into Drury Lane. Find brick patterns in the left wall.
